About the Park School

The Park School is a PreK to Grade 8 independent school in Brookline, MA dedicated to excellence in education. The ideal candidate will bring teaching experience and draw upon that understanding to continue to strengthen the after school program at The Park School.

In addition to teaching ability, the position requires expertise with the social and emotional needs of this age group. A commitment to creating a balanced, encouraging environment that supports the needs of a range of students will be essential in building our after-school community. At The Park School, faculty engage respectfully with families and demonstrate sensitivity to cultures, values, configurations, and beliefs.

Roles & Responsibilities

- Establish and maintain a healthy and trusting learning environment, fostering nurturing relationships with students
- Guide students in their social-emotional development, maintaining expectations and support for positive and productive student behavior
- Respectfully engage with a diverse community and ensure that diversity, equity and inclusion is emphasized as a core value of the School.
- Regularly communicate with families about ASP happenings
- Candidates must be enthusiastic, energetic and enjoy working in a fast-paced after school environment with students in Grades 6-8.
- Collaboration, flexibility, a nurturing disposition and a love of working with young people are essential.
